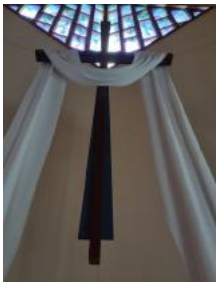

Each week, God gathers us to be fed and nourished at the Lord's table, and then sends us out with hearts full of love to serve our neighbor. This rhythm is important for us to sustain our faith in a weary world. God can feed us in many other ways too, of course. Perhaps around family tables, talking with a neighbor at the checkout line of the grocery store, and in those little interactions we might have with the beauty of nature or a really good cup of coffee. God is always seeking to sustain us with a word, with a bit of bread, with a loving touch.

During the month of November, we turn our hearts and minds to God with thanksgiving. We give thanks for the year of God's provision and the promise of continued care. We fervently pray for our hearts to remain open, soft, and willing to follow the way of Jesus, the way of radical love. May God continue to transform us more and more each day into the people God hopes for us to be. Amen.

Secretary's Report - Motion made by Donna and seconded by Paul to accept the August 2025 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - As of 9/18/25, checking \$8,7715.42, missions account \$348.22, savings balance \$554.19, Thrivent mortgage balance \$25,774.65, Thrivent savings \$3,497.15, WELCA \$1,631.02.

Motion made by Lynn and seconded by Paul to accept the September 2025 treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report -

Superior Churches: Our Community Meal ministry began on Sept. 7th. Zion has been assigned to October 5th. Our next shared meeting is at Our Saviors on Oct. 23 at 5pm.

Food Shelf Ministry: For God's Work, Our Hands Sunday we made 207 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. Pilgrim Lutheran donated supplies to make them and \$283 toward the new cupboard. Thanks to Jamie Holm (and family) and Vicky Holm for getting supplies and building the cupboard. We will be reimbursing them out of the food shelf fund. We received a donation of beef (600 pounds) and lamb (50 pounds) from Indianhead Credit Union at the end of August. A meatloaf dinner is being organized for Friday, Sept. 26th. Other food related projects will be coming! We are also hopeful we will be able to use some of the donated ground beef for our pasty bake in November.

Pride Festival: This year we were able to get a table at the Family Pride Festival in Superior. We had information about Zion and had fun handouts (ducks, mini Jesus, tattoos) as well as glitter blessings. Paul Robinson and Kyle Biggar joined me as we talked to lots of people in the community about Zion and God's wide welcome. It was a great event! We have been invited to join other churches in the Duluth-Superior area who meet on the last Tuesday of the month to talk about LGBTQIA+ issues and how to be involved in local events like the Pride Festival.

Fall Ministry: We have officially begun our education programming with Worship Wanderers, Logos, Wednesday bible study, and Sunday adult education time. The Superior Stitchers are back on the first and third Thursdays at 1pm.

Other Ministry: Website is now updated and amazing! Thanks to Paul Robinson and Jackie Mehlberg for their work on getting it ready to go.

Coming Up: Blessing of the Pets on October 5th, New Member Sunday Celebration on Oct. 19, and Confirmation on Oct. 26, and Trunk-or-Treat on Oct. 29.

homework time, 5:30 everyone gathers for dinner, 6:00 is a small worship service, and then everyone gathers for small groups. Lynn shared the new format is working well, they have some things to work out, but overall the excitement was great and positive.

Worship Wanderers also began on Sunday. This past week was a success. It was great to see so many children join in on the fun. It is a great tie into families and visitors in our congregation. They have a great group of teachers and once everyone is comfortable, each teacher should be able to take one Sunday a month. There was some discussion about potential mobility concerns with the stairs, but everyone is on board to accommodate if needed.

Worship & Music - Met in the beginning of September to arrange Sundays until Advent season. Thinking ahead to Christmas and candles, using the traditional wax candles one more year and then perhaps transitioning to another option. There are concerns of wax on the pew. Polly mentioned bringing more music into Wednesday nights. Shannon mentioned that the older youth might be interested in leading a group to play songs with rhythm sticks.

Property - We need a lift to install the new light bulbs. Duluth rental is \$200 for 1 week. Menards is \$75 per day. A scissor lift is a safer choice for the install. Paul mentioned it would be nice to have a maintenance committee that meets and does maintenance around the church. Lynn recommended adding that idea to the next property committee meeting. The outside wall was painted and is complete. Lynn mentioned they will be getting quotes to have the hallway professionally cleaned. While we have a carpet cleaner, we need some professional help removing stains. We have plastic runners somewhere in the church, it was recommended they be put out before pasty bake and voting.

Stewardship - Did not meet this month.

WELCA - Cookie and craft sale December 13th, 2025. Paul is organizing a registration for the event.

Motion made by Paul and seconded by Vicky to accept the September 2025 committee reports. Motion carried.

Unfinished business -

Church Directory Planning Committee needed - Sara reached out to Harmann Studios to do a church directory in late January. Dates to follow.

Gluten Free Pasty Testing - Vicky brought another option. This is a vegan crust option. Everyone agreed that this was by far the best option.

Outdoor banner update - Polly has the parking lot banner. Talked to Tim about putting in new 4x4 signs. We will need new fall banners.

New Food Shelf Cabinet - Property committee will do some tweaks to get the new cabinet ready to go for the upcoming winter season.

Community Christmas Dinner Planning - Vicky will need help to plan the event this year. She has a large list of things that can be improved for the upcoming event.

Date for Fall Pasty Sale - November 5th-8th, pasty committee will work on food order and volunteers.

Plan for holiday season flyer as a bag stuffer - Advertise holiday services, meals, cookie sale at pasty sale bags.

Replace choir loft computer - Tabled for October.

Thank you notes - Lynn wanted to ensure there is a system for thank you notes for items that are donated, time that is shared, or other needed various jobs around the church.

Jesus (the statue) Donna mentioned concerns with missing Jesus (the statue) and wondering if we can get a photo or perhaps another smaller statue of Jesus to replace his absence. Suggested to see if Tim can take a photo of the statue to be put on a canvas.

Motion to adjourn at 7:45pm by Vicky, second by Shannon. Motion carried.

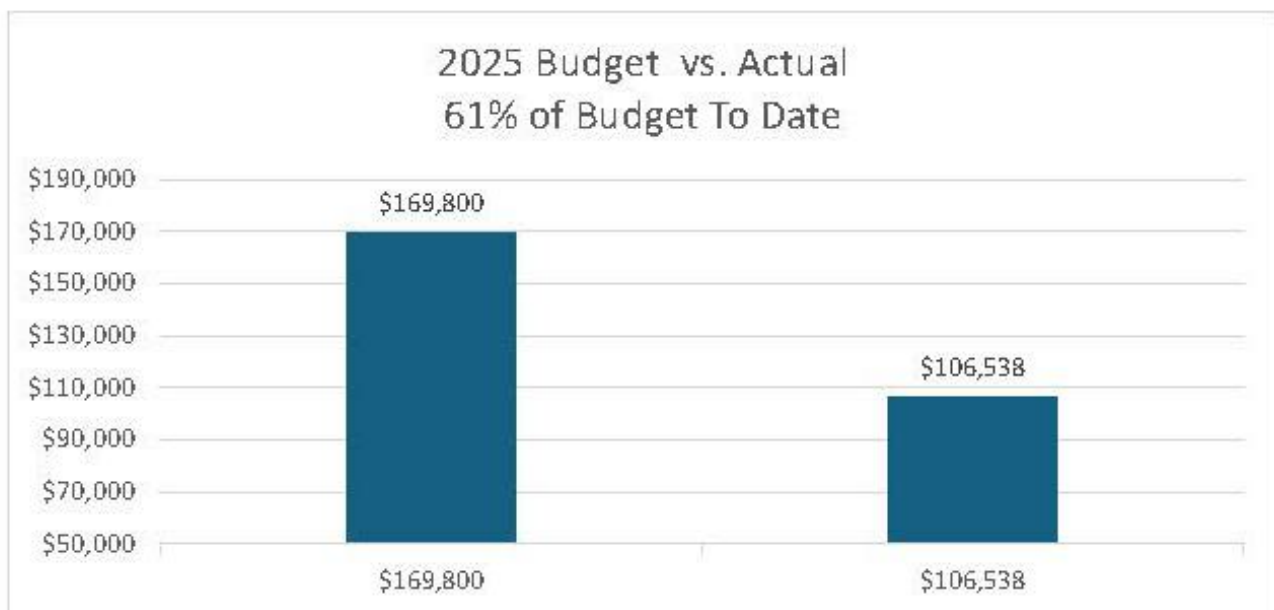

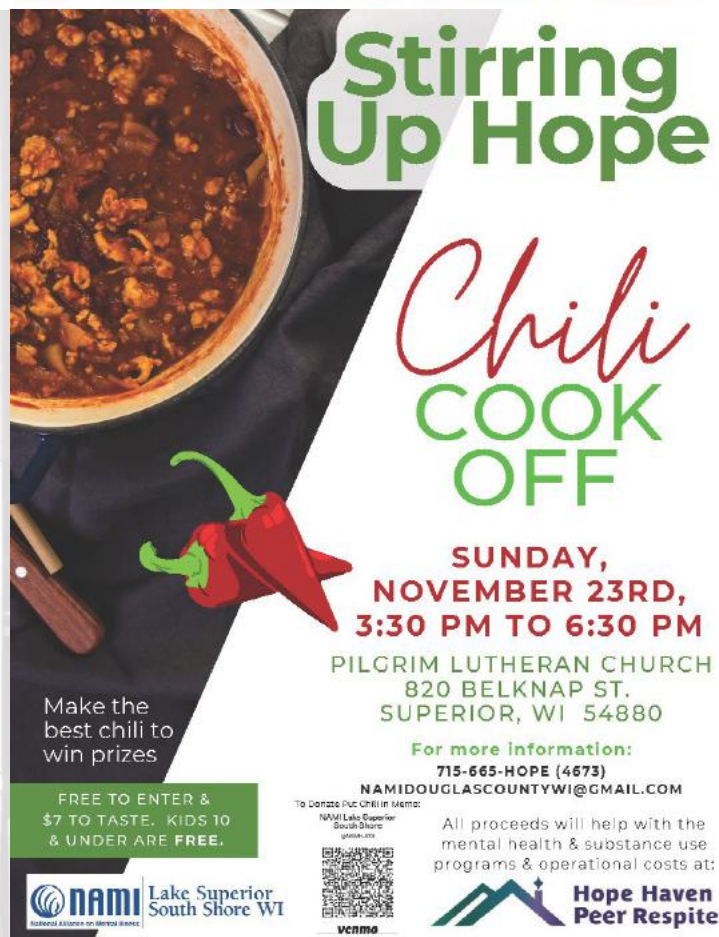
